



Participation Guidelines

Sportsman's Park Trapshooting Program

The following participation guidelines apply to Naperville Park District Sportsman's Park Trapshooting Program during the 2020 Summer Program Season. The Illinois Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity Phase 3 Outdoor Recreation Guidelines, in addition to information from public health organizations, was used in the development of the guidelines. The guidelines are subject to change as new information becomes available.

Range Employees & Volunteers

- Range Employees and Volunteers will be provided instruction/education on COVID-19 prevention.
- All employees and volunteers must perform a self-assessment daily and not report to work if they are ill or exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19. If an individual begins to exhibit symptoms during the program they must be isolated from others before being picked up to leave.*
- If a staff member or volunteer has symptoms, they should wait to enter the premises until they have had no fever for at least 72 hours, other symptoms have improved, and at least 10 days have passed since their symptoms first appeared, and after afebrile and feeling well (without fever-reducing medication) for at least 72 hours OR has 2 negative COVID-19 tests in a row, with testing done at least 24 hours apart.*
- Employees and volunteers should maintain a minimum of 6 feet distance from others, unless the performance of duties makes it impractical. Employees and volunteers are required to wear a face covering if a minimum 6 foot distance cannot be maintained from others. This includes, but is not limited to the check-in and check-out process, while escorting shooters to and from the trapshooting field, use of restrooms, etc. When indoors, employees and volunteers are required to wear a face covering while in public spaces or interacting with others.
- Hand washing or hand sanitizing is recommended before and after activities. Additional handwashing breaks may be needed.

Participants

- Participants must conduct a self-assessment daily and not attend the program if they are ill or exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19. At the time of arrival program staff will ask the participant, or the parent/guardian, if the participant is currently exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms. If an individual begins to exhibit

symptoms during the program they must be isolated from others before being picked up to leave.*

- If a participant has symptoms, they should wait to enter the premises until they have had no fever for at least 72 hours, other symptoms have improved, and at least 10 days have passed since their symptoms first appeared, and after afebrile and feeling well (without fever-reducing medication) for at least 72 hours OR has 2 negative COVID-19 tests in a row, with testing done at least 24 hours apart.
- While indoors, participants are required to wear a face covering at all times while in public spaces or interacting with others. If outdoors, participants are required to wear a face covering if a minimum 6 feet distance cannot be maintained from others, unless wearing a face covering is impractical due to the activity. The required use of face coverings includes, but is not limited to, the check-in and check-out process, while being escorted by range staff or volunteers to and from the trapshooting field, use of restrooms, etc.
- Program participants will be required to provide their own face coverings. The NPD recommends participants have additional face coverings on hand, if needed.
- Personal items should have proper separation and should not be shared with other participants. All participants must provide their own equipment, including shotgun, ear plugs, safety glasses, and shell bags. Ammunition will be included in the cost of the round and provided to the shooter upon check-in. All shooters must prep their equipment at their cars.
- Handwashing or hand sanitizing will be encouraged often.
- No socializing or extra-curricular activities before or after shooting.
- Maintain 6 foot distancing, except when the activity requires close interaction with the employees, volunteers, or other participants.
- Participants should travel to the range alone or with a member(s) of their immediate household, if possible. No carpooling.

Program Details

- Only experienced shooters will be allowed to shoot, where the shooter is fully knowledgeable of trapshooting fundamentals, gun safety and can shoot independent and with no assistance required.
- Range capacity and class sizes (employees, volunteers, and participants) will be limited based on available space and the ability to social distance between participants.
- Gatherings are limited to 10 people while the region is in Phase 3 of the Restore Illinois Plan issued by the Governor's Office. Gatherings may increase to 50 people, if space allows, when the region moves to Phase 4. If multiple groups meet within the park area, 30 feet of distance must be maintained between groups.
- Reservations to shoot will be required. Reservations can be made by contacting the Naperville Park District registration office at 630-848-5000, Mon.-Fri., 8:30 am-5:00 pm beginning Mon., June 15. Individuals who do not have a Park District account will need to establish one when calling in to make a reservation; an account also may be set up in advance online at <https://apm.activecommunities.com/napervilleparks>.

- Reservations for Thursday and Sunday shooting sessions may be made only for the current week. Reservations for Thursdays must be made by noon on Thursday; Sunday reservations must be made by 5:00 pm on Friday.
- Initially, squads will be scheduled to occur every 30 minutes per field, and start times on each field will be staggered.
- Shooting will occur in 5-Shooter squads. The squads comply with the 6 foot social distancing, as 16 yd. post positions are 3 yds. (9 ft.) apart.
- No outside ammunition will be allowed. All ammunition must be purchased from the facility during the reservation process and will be included in the cost of the round.
- Participants must check-in with the Range Officer located near the garage upon arrival.
- Participants are asked to not arrive more than 10 minutes prior to their reservation time. Participants should not congregate in common areas or the parking lot following shooting.
- Individuals must not gather in groups of more than 10 people while Naperville is in Phase 3 of the Restore Illinois Plan.
- Range areas will be setup before arrival of participants. Range equipment should only be touched by range employees and volunteers.
- Social distancing will be reinforced through employee training and reinforcement with participants. All shooters must remain outside of the range fence until their squad is called to the field.
- Lost and founds will be eliminated from park operations.
- Reservations cancelled or delayed due to inclement weather will be refunded to participants. Cancellations initiated by participants must be made a minimum of 24 hours in advance in order to receive a refund.

Sanitization

- Sanitizer products used for equipment and supplies will meet CDC guidelines.
- Cleaning products will include EPA-approved disinfectants or disinfecting wipes for sanitizing any equipment used by participants.
- Whenever possible, equipment and personal items should have proper separation and should not be shared with others. Participants are encouraged to provide their own equipment for the program. If equipment must be shared among participants, staff should sanitize equipment before and after use at programs.

Restrooms

- Access to the Sportsman's Park Clubhouse will be for restroom use only. No congregating or storage of guns or shell bags is permitted in the clubhouse.
- Clubhouse restrooms will be cleaned at minimum once daily using EPA-registered disinfectants, particularly on high-touch surfaces such as faucets, toilets, doorknobs and light switches.
- Supplies for handwashing, including soap and materials for drying hands will be checked and stocked every time the restroom is cleaned.
- Program staff and participants will be required to wash hands with every restroom visit.
