

Dear Day Camp Parents and Guardians,

Welcome to the Naperville Park District's day camp program. Below I have outlined specific details about your child's day camp experience. The first session begins on Monday, June 14<sup>th</sup> with additional sessions being offered weekly through August 13<sup>th</sup>.

### General Camp Information

- **Camp Seager Director Phone – 630-219-8767**
- **Camp Frontier Director Phone – 630-335-4958**
- Registration for camp will close at 5pm on the Wednesday prior to the start of each new week. In order to safely staff and organize camp groups, this will be strictly enforced.
- Any absences **must** be reported to your camp's Director. If you are unable to notify the Director in the morning, you must still report the absence prior to your child's return the following day. This is to verify that the absence was not related to Covid-19.
- Groups will consist of up to 10 campers. Groups will remain static each week and interaction with other groups may be limited to times when distancing can be maintained.
- Provide your child with at least two face coverings for camp each day.
- Provide a lunch and drinks for your child every day except Friday when a pizza lunch will be provided. Send a refillable water bottle with your child each day.
- Provide your child with a bathing suit and towel on their swim day.

### Drop Off & Pick Up Procedures

- A drive through drop-off/ pick-up system will be in place this summer and we ask that families remain in their vehicle and follow the direction of staff when they arrive on site.
- The first day you attend camp you will receive a laminated placard with your last name and account number. This placard will be assigned to you for the entire summer and **must be displayed** on the right side dashboard of your vehicle when dropping off and picking up.
- If you have two different vehicles being used at drop off and pick up please send an email and I will issue your family a second placard.
- As you pull up to the drop-off / pick-up area, prior to your child exiting the vehicle, be prepared that we will ask you if your child is experiencing any of the Covid-19 symptoms. If your response is no then our designated staff will proceed to sign your child in. You will not be required to physically sign in nor will you be required to get out of your vehicle at any time.
- If you should need to speak with camp staff or if you forget your placard, we will ask you to pull off to the side where a staff member will come to you. This will help us to keep the line of cars moving quickly.
- Pick-up will follow a similar procedure. When you arrive for pick-up be sure to have your placard displayed on your dashboard as this is how we will identify you. Please remain in your vehicle as we call up your child for departure.

### Centennial Beach Swim Days

- Day camps will have the opportunity to participate in 1 beach day per week.

- Due to the restrictions on bussing large groups of children, camps will meet at the Riverwalk Grand Pavilion on your child's swim day. The Riverwalk Grand Pavilion, 912 Honorary Sindt Memorial Ct, Naperville, IL 60540 is located in the parking lot behind Centennial Beach.
- Camp **Seager** Swim Day – Every **Tuesday**
- Camp **Frontier** Swim Day – Every **Thursday**
- **Drop Off & Pick Up** will take place at the Grand Pavilion on your child's swim day.

### **Camp Entertainment & Activities**

- On-Site entertainment will be making visits to camp every Friday. The type of entertainment will include reptile shows, musicians, interactive comedy and more. A pizza lunch will also be provided every Friday.
- The park district has partnered with Inside Out Club DuPage this summer. They will be visiting day camp every other week and leading a community focused service project.
- The Naperville Public Library will be visiting day camps to lead an interactive story and provide campers an opportunity to participate in their summer reading program.
- Daily camp activities will include theme days, water days, arts & crafts, sports and more.

### **Rain Site Information**

- **Camp Seager Rain Site** – Mill Street Elementary School - 1300 North Mill Street Naperville, Illinois 60563.
- **Camp Frontier Rain Site** – Neuqua Valley High School, Birkett Freshman Campus - 3220 Cedar Glade Drive, Naperville, IL 60564
- Procedures for drop-off and pick-up at the rain site will be the same as regular camp days with staff managing the drive through drop off and pick-up procedures.
- Rain site information will be updated by 6:30am each morning if the decision has been made to move the camp indoors.
- **Important Note** – The Park District will not be providing any bus service this summer due to the social distancing restrictions. For this reason the rain site may be activated more frequently than in previous years. If the weather forecast is questionable we may call a rain site day. This does not necessarily mean we will stay indoors all day it just means we may have to work out of the rain site location.
- If an unforeseen storm happens during the day when camp is in the outdoor park location, we will shelter in place for up to 45 minutes. If the storm persists past this allotted time, day camp will be cancelled and we will contact you to pick up your camper.

Details regarding the status of activities are segmented by the specific sport or facility. Parents can manage text/email subscriptions by selecting the activity or facility (in this case the activity would be "Day Camps") and establishing the length of time for which to receive notifications (in this case you may choose just the dates that your child is registered for camp).

### **COVID-19 Response**

The Naperville Park District follows the guidelines issued by the State of Illinois under the Restore Illinois Plan in the operation of programs and facilities. The guidelines issued by the State are developed by the Illinois Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity (DCEO) and the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH). We encourage parents and participants to review the current state guidelines available on the park district website at <https://www.napervilleparks.org/coronavirus> prior to participating in summer programs. We also encourage families to check the website often as state guidelines are updated frequently. The following are a few of the guidelines that currently apply to all park district programs.

#### Self-assessment

Participants must conduct a self-assessment daily and not attend a Park District program if they are ill or exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19.

#### Face Coverings

Per Executive Order issued by the Governor on May 17, 2021, individuals who have been fully vaccinated for COVID-19 are no longer required to wear face coverings while visiting Naperville Park District parks, programs or facilities (both indoors and outdoors). Any individual who is over the age of two, not fully vaccinated, and able to medically tolerate a face covering is required to cover their nose and mouth with a face covering when in a public place and unable to maintain a six-foot social distance.

Social Distance: Practice social distancing. Stay at least 6 feet (about 2 arms' lengths) from other people who do not reside in your household.
